1. Discuss the importance of pre-Columbian demography on the territory that will become the United States of America. In shaping your response, discuss the total population of the Americas, and the specific estimates regarding North America. To what degree were there powerful native tribes in place to thwart European settlement in North America?

*Generally speaking, this question was answered well. You clarified that most of the native population was located in Spanish America, like the Incas and the Aztecs, and as such, England encountered a disorganized, warring, scattered native population. For full credit, I wish you to comment on the Iroquois and their location. Would settlement been different had the English encountered this tribe? Explain your response in a redo.*

5. Discuss the factors that caused the English to start late on colonization.

*Again, well done. Four key observations, as already clarified in lecture, are key for this. First, England and Spain were allies and united under Catholicism. Second, the Protestant Reformation was key. Explain this. Third, was the subjugation of Ireland. Last, was the confrontation and defeat of Spain following 1588. Explain these.*

8. Describe the Puritans and their beliefs and explain why they left England for the New World.

*Most clarified the key beliefs of Puritanism well. You discussed effectively predestination and the concept of the Elect. The reason for leaving England was done less well. Recall, that the crown in England challenged Puritans. How? Mention Charles I and Bishop Laud. Also, economics at home in largely depressed wollen districts is key. Finally, a brief discussion of the affirmative or positive reasons Puritans came to the new world is very much in order. You recall that they did not wish to separate, but rather reform. They also wished to create what upon a hill? Explain what they meant.*

10. Describe the central features of the middle colonies and explain how they differed from New England.

*For this question, much detail is required. Reread your response and check for completion. First, comment on economy. Next, discuss geographical layout. For the rest of your response, be certain to*

*comment briefly on each: demographic diversity, religious toleration, labor, politics, and relation with England.*
