Language Arts/ Reading/ Writing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>J.A. BizTown:</u> Last week we completed unit two of the J.A. Biz Town curriculum. Unit 2 focused on Financial Literacy. Students will identify financial institutes, name the services they provide and describe the movement of money between banks, people, and businesses. Students will practice making a deposit, identify parts of a checkbook, maintain an accurate check register, and determine the consequences of insufficient funds. Finally we will discuss the benefits of an interest-earning savings account and how money grows in this type of account. They will also explore their options and use their decision making skills to choose an establishment that could best meet their needs. • <u>This week we will move forward with Unit 3: Work Readiness.</u> Students will complete their job application and participate in interviews next Friday.
