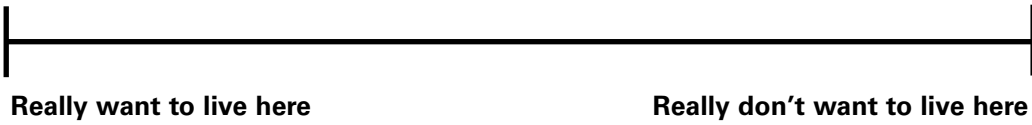


Examine the map that your teacher has projected. Then, working with a partner, record answers to the questions below.

7. Why do you think so much shipbuilding took place in the New England Colonies?

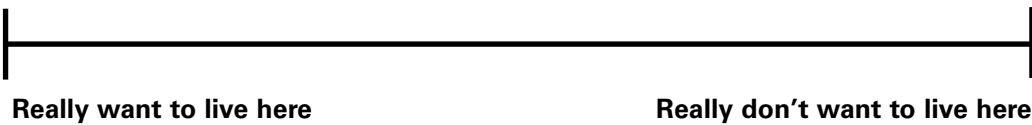
