

# Look into My Eyes



Do you see children in your classroom who may have these symptoms? They may have an undiagnosed vision problem,

- Struggling to read or remain on task. Reads below grade level.
- Crossed eyes or wandering eyes.
- Clumsiness--misjudging distances. Bumps into classmates and things.
- Loses place while reading.
- Tilts head or closes an eye when reading.
- Holds reading material and other objects close.
- Has trouble copying from the board.
- Cannot see white background overhead projections.
- Eyes appear to "dance" involuntarily.
- Gets into trouble for inattentiveness and daydreaming and being off task.
- Little or no pigment in skin, eyes and hair.
- Watery, crusty, itchy, chronically red eyes.
- Difficulty distinguishing certain colors.
- Sensitivity to light and glare.
- White pupil instead of black.
- Squinting
