<p>General Info</p> <p>1. Legends are exaggerated stories told to remember the actions of a person, who made a difference in history.</p> <p>Hyperbole is used to tell the story.</p> <p>Celebration, nostalgia, and humor are common moods of the legend.</p>	
<p>Protagonist</p> <p>2. The protagonist of a legend was/is real. The author exaggerates the story about this historical person ... this legend.</p>	
<p>3. The setting of a legend does reflect the specific historical time and place in which the protagonist lived. The historical facts are exaggerated.</p> <p>Hyperbole is great exaggeration.</p>	

<p>Theme</p> <p>4. The themes of legends tell the stories of the actions of real people - actions that have been recorded in history.</p>	
<p>Rationale</p> <p>5. Legends honor the daily life of a person. Hyperbole is used to highlight the events of that person's life. Legends celebrate what a person can accomplish.</p>
