

FORMAT FOR BIBLIOGRAPHY ENTRIES

A. BOOKS

1. One Author

Author's Last Name, First Name. Book Title. Place of Publication: Publisher, Copyright date.

Example:

Jay, David. Ancient Egyptians. Brookfield, Connecticut: Copper Beech Books, 2000.

2. Two Authors

1st Author's Last Name, First Name, and 2nd Author's First Name, Last Name. Book Title. Place of Publication: Publisher, Copyright date.

Example:

Harris, Geraldine, and Delia Pemberton. Illustrated Encyclopedia of Ancient Egypt. Lincolnwood, Illinois: Peter Bedrick Books, 1999.

3. More than two authors

1st Author's Last Name, First Name, et al. Book Title. Place of Publication: Publisher, Copyright date.

4. Editor (No specific Author)

Editor's Last Name, First Name, ed. Book Title. Place of Publication: Publisher, Copyright date.

2. PRINT ENCYCLOPEDIAS

1. Signed Article (Author's name is given at the beginning or the end of the article)

Author's Last Name, First Name. "Article Title."
Encyclopedia Title, Copyright date, Volume number,
page number(s) of the entire article.

Example:

Lesko, Leonard H. "Pharaoh." The World Book
Encyclopedia, 2001, Vol. 15, p. 353.

2. Unsigned Article

"Article Title." Encyclopedia Title, Copyright date, Volume
number, page number(s) of the entire article.

Example:

"Hieroglyphics." The World Book Student Discovery
Encyclopedia, 2000, Vol. 5, p. 153.

3. MAGAZINES (PERIODICALS)

Author's Last Name, First Name. "Article Title." Magazine
Title Date of Magazine: Page numbers of the entire
article.

Example:

Bianchi, Robert S. "Arsinoe II: A Macedonian Queen of
Egypt." Calliope: World History for Young People
Nov./Dec. 1991: 28-33.

4. ELECTRONIC SOURCES

1. World Wide Web

Editor or author's Last Name, First Name. "Web Page Title." Web Site Title. Date of Access (when you looked at the site) <URL>.

Example:

"Life in Ancient Egypt: Daily Life," Carnegie Museum of Natural History. 3 Apr. 2003 <<http://www.carnegie museums.org/cmnh/exhibits/egypt/dailylife.html>>.

2. Web Encyclopedia

Author's Last Name, First Name (of article, if available). "Article Title." Name of Encyclopedia. Name of Sponsoring Institution, Date of Access (when you looked at the site) URL.

Example:

Matthai, James. "Nile River." The New Book of Knowledge 2008. Grolier Online. 2 Jan. 2008 <<http://nbk.grolier.com/cgi-bin/article?assetid=a2020960-h>>.
