Hunting for Shapes

Use everyday objects to help your child identify simple shapes.

- Select a household object that is the shape of a circle, triangle, square, or rectangle. Ask your child to identify the shape.
- Think of an object in the room and provide clues such as its shape, color, or size until your child can guess the object.

Shape Designs

Work with your child to make shape designs.

- Cut several circles, rectangles, and triangles out of paper. Use colored paper or have your child color the shapes.
- Invite your child to use the shapes to design a picture or a pattern. Ask your child to describe the shapes.
