Two (2) **EMT Academy Orientation Programs** will be held for those who are presently **Juniors**. Parents / legal guardians are strongly encouraged to attend. The purpose is to give a detailed overview of the **Paramedic Pathways Programs: Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)-Basic** during grade 12 and the **EMT-Paramedic Program** offered at **Howard Community College** upon successful State Certification testing at the EMT-B level.

Much of the EMT-Paramedic Certificate / AAS Program at HCC is funded by the Howard County Department of Fire & Rescue Service.

You need only attend one (1) of the offerings as they are identical offerings. These sessions typically last 60 – 90 minutes and allow plenty of time for questions and answers.
