

# Read-Around Display

Make a read-around display about a book you have read.

### You need:

- two 6" X 18" strips of light-colored construction paper<sup>or tagboard</sup> attached end to end
- crayons or markers
- string
- ruler
- tape or glue
- hole punch (if available)

### Directions:

1. Write the title and author across the top of the paper.
2. Draw two long writing lines across the width of the paper. Use the lines to write a description of your favorite part of the book.



3. Draw colorful scenes from the book along the bottom of the paper. Write a short description under each scene.
4. Bend the paper into a circle. Tape or glue the edges together. Cut three equal-length pieces of string. Punch three holes about the same distance apart near the top of the circle. Attach the pieces of string and tie at the top as shown.



Use a lot of detail. Try to use various colors, and fill the paper.

### Book Project

Jot down any special instructions from your teacher here.

On notebook paper, write 4 paragraphs to tell about the plot, setting, characters and your opinion.

**Brainwork!** Draw and cut out a picture of a character from the book. Attach to a long piece of string and hang the picture through the center so it shows below the read-around scene. You do not do brainwork, unless you want to.
