ADMISSION STANDARDS

Granted full admission by one of the following options:

1. Complete the College Preparatory Curriculum (CPC) with minimum 3.2 high school grade point average (GPA) on the CPC;

Or

2. Complete the CPC with: (a) a minimum 2.5 GPA on the CPC or class rank in the 50% and (b) a score of 16 or higher on the ACT or SAT equivalent;

Or

3. Complete the CPC with: (a) a minimum of 2.0 GPA on the CPC and (b) a score of 18 or higher on the ACT or SAT equivalent;

Or

4. Satisfy the NCAA standards for student athletes who are "Full Qualifiers" under Division I Guidelines (Effective August 1, 1996). Must have 2.5 GPA on the CPC and ACT score of 17 or SAT equivalent.

CPC Courses:

English: 4 units, Math: 3 units (Algebra, Algebra II, and Geometry), Science: 3 units, Social Science: 3 units, Advanced Electives: 2 units and Computer: ½ unit.

Transfer Students:

Junior College Students with less than the required 24* hours and 2.0 GPA will be required to submit their high school transcript.

* Must include 6 hrs of English, 3 hrs College Algebra, 6 hrs of Science (one must be lab based), and 9 elective hrs.

*** STUDENTS WHO DO NOT MEET THE REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION UNDER NORMAL CIRCUMSTANCES MUST FOLLOW ONE OF THE SPECIAL ADMISSION OPTIONS AS FOLLOWS:**

Special Admission Options

Accuplacer Testing*

Students who do not meet regular admission standards will be required to participate in a screening test called the Accuplacer* before being considered for admission to the University. Students successfully completing the Accuplacer Test* will be granted full admission. Students who prove to need remediation will be required to participate and successfully complete the Summer Development Program before being admitted. You will be contacted by mail if you are required to participate after we receive the regular admission requirements.

** Accuplacer Testing is only administered January-May prior to planned enrollment for Fall Semester.*

Summer Development Program

Students who do not successfully pass the Accuplacer will be required to participate in the Summer Development Program. The program meets for nine weeks (June-August) and covers courses in reading, composition and mathematics. Upon successful completion of the Summer Development Program, a student will be granted full admission to the University but must participate in the year-long academic support program. Students failing the program will be advised to pursue other educational alternatives.

Presidential Academic Scholarship

Requirements: Incoming Freshmen, College Preparatory Curriculum GPA of 3.50, ACT score of 27 or above, or SAT equivalent. Covers Full Tuition, Room, Board, Fees & Books- Campus Only, 15 credit hours required each semester, must maintain cumulative 3.50 GPA required for 3 year renewal.

Deadline: Postmarked by February 15th.

Valedictorian/ Salutatorian Academic Scholarship

Requirements: Incoming Freshmen, who attained the Honor of Valedictorian or Salutatorian of graduating class. Covers full Tuition, Room & Board charges- Campus Only, renewed for 3 years if cumulative GPA of 3.25 is maintained. **Deadline: Postmarked by June 15th.**

Full Academic Scholarship

Requirements: Incoming Freshmen, College Preparatory Curriculum GPA of "B", ACT score of 25-26, or SAT equivalent. Covers Full Tuition, Room & Board- Campus Charges Only; must maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.25 for 3 year scholarship renewal; 15 semester hours required each semester. Incoming **Deadline: Postmarked by February 15th.**

Half Academic Scholarship

Requirements: Incoming Freshmen, College Preparatory Curriculum GPA of "B", ACT score of 22-24, or SAT equivalent. Covers half the cost of Tuition, Room & Board- Campus Charges Only, must maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.25 for 3 year scholarship renewal; 15 semester hours required each semester. **Deadline: Postmarked by February 15th.**

Tuition Academic Scholarship

Requirements: Incoming Freshmen, high school average of "B", ACT score of 22-24, or SAT equivalent. Covers tuition only, 15 credit hours required each semester, cumulative 3.25 GPA required for 3 years for scholarship renewal. **Deadline: Postmarked by February 15th.**

Leadership Award Scholarship

Requirements: College Preparatory GPA of "B", ACT score of 20-21, or SAT equivalent, participated in leadership roll in school and community, two letters of recommendation from school/ community leaders. Covers: \$1000 per academic year. Must maintain 15 hours per semester, renewed for 3 years if 3.0 cumulative GPA is maintained. **Deadline: Postmarked by February 15th.**

3. Any group(s) not adhering to the above guidelines and time designation without proper notification within ***THIRTY (30) minutes*** of scheduled tour cannot be guaranteed an orientation or a walking tour of Jackson State University.

FINANCIAL AID

Make sure you have a Mac or PC with:

- A modem and phone line, or direct connection to the Internet
- Netscape Navigator or Internet Explorer
- A printer (desirable, not required, if you have access to your electronic pin # you can sign the form electronically,
- You can request your pin # when you get to the signature page of the FAFSA form)

Gather documents showing your and, if you're a dependent, your parents' finances:

- Your social security card and driver's license
- W-2 forms
- Income tax returns: (for example 1040, 1040EZ, 1040A, whichever form you filed with the IRS)
- Records of untaxed benefits such as Social Security, Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), or veterans benefits
- Current bank statements
- Records of other savings and investments

For example, for the 2006-2007 school year, you will need 2005 tax return form.

How To Use FAFSA on the Web

*** Important Notes ***

- A. Print the signature page and mail to the address on your signature page. (If you submit the application and do not print and mail the signature page, your application will not be processed.) After printing the signature page, click the "Submit My FAFSA" button at the top of the screen to send your application through the Internet. You'll be taken to a screen that says "Your application has been submitted". Note the confirmation stamp number.
- B. Print the congratulation page and keep it.
- C. To check the status of your application, call (800) 433-3243 or (319) 337-5665
- D. To select Jackson State University's code, you must do the following:
 1. Fill in the school name (Jackson State University) and School code (002410)
 2. Click on the SEARCH button
 3. Click on OK button to confirm a code
