College Credit NOW courses are provided in conjunction with Chemeketa Community College

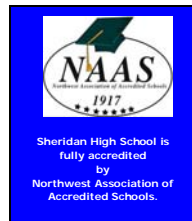
Extra Curricular and Co-Curricular activities are provided.



Sheridan is ideally situated in the heart of the magnificent Northwest, near the eastern slope of the coast mountain range, nestled along the South Yamhill River in the Willamette Valley. It is just 31 miles from the Pacific Ocean, 48 miles southwest of Portland and 25 miles northwest of Salem.

On the southern edge of Yamhill County, Sheridan employment areas are: Casino, Federal Corrections, lumber, wood products, manufacturing and farming. Crops include a variety of grasses, grains, tree fruits and nuts, grain, cattle and horses.

Sheridan enjoys a mild climate, with an average temperature of 83 in July and 32 in January. Precipitation averages 42.7 inches per year, making the area green and lush.

Background

Facility

The high school has an adequate site of 27 acres. The first high school was built at this location in 1919, with additional construction in 1948. The current building was built in 1958 around the 1948 gym. The second phase was built in 1963. After the "Spring Break Quake" of 1997, the gym was declared unsafe until posts were put in place to support the ceiling beams. The Sheridan community sponsored a bond to build a new state-of-the-art gymnasium.



The capacity for the high school is approximately 320. Given the present enrollment, it is within 90% of capacity. The high school's growth pattern from the 1980's through 2007, showed a year-to-year fluctuation, with a range in enrollment from a low of 178 to a high of 288. Currently, incoming freshmen classes have exceeded 90 students.

We are proud to have the 100th graduating class for the 2007-2008 school year.

Staffing

Sheridan High School staff meet NCLB highly qualified requirements. The majority of the staff have advanced degrees in their subject areas. Each staff member is responsible for being a class and club advisor.

High School Preparation

9th Grade - Get to know your counselor as well as your class advisor. Know where your career and college information center is located.

10th Grade - Explore a variety of electives, become involved in school or community activities, take the PSAT/NMSQT tests.

11th Grade - Take classes that offer college credit, meet with the counselor to discuss college requirements, contact colleges that interest you, investigate scholarships, take SAT I, ACT or SAT II, or other exams required for college admission and discuss ideas for your Senior Project with your advisor.

12th Grade - Take classes that offer college credit, complete necessary financial aid forms (FAFSA), check college admission requirements, visit colleges, ask for letters of recommendation, complete college applications, complete scholarship applications, take SAT I, ACT or SAT II and complete your Senior Project.

All grades should take challenging classes required for your grade level.
