

Bibliography Format

For your final bibliography, each reference item needs to be listed in alphabetical order by the first letter of the entry and the second line of an entry needs to be indented. See examples below:

Dudley, Margot. "Violence Sweeps Territories, Israel." *The Jerusalem Post*. Oct. 2, 2000: 1

"Greece-Crete Clashes." CNN. Oct. 2, 2002.

Reich, Bernard. "Israel." *World Book Encyclopedia*, 2000.

Sample entries

(Typed bibliographies use italics for titles. Handwritten bibliographies use an underline for titles)

Book (one author)

- **Author. Title. Place of Publication: Publisher, copyright date: pages**
- Holiday, Laurel. *Children of Israel, Children of Palestine: Our Own True Stories*. New York: Pocket Books, 1998: 123-126.

Book (two authors)

- Schiff, Ze'ev and Ehud Ya'ari. *Intifada*. New York: Simon & Schuster, 1989.
- *Note: Use the first author's name that appears on the title page as the first author, other names follow by first name then last name.*

Article in a Reference Book

- **Author. "Article." *Encyclopedia*, copyright date: pages.**
- Reich, Bernard. "Israel." *World Book Encyclopedia*, 2000: 75-77.

Magazine Article (can be used for Newspaper, too)

- **Author. "Article." *Magazine Title*. Date: pages.**
- Hirschberg, Peter. "Primed to Win." *The Jerusalem Report*. Sept. 25, 2000: 14-17.

Personal Interview

- **Name of person. Personal Interview. Date of interview.**
- Sills, Robert. Personal Interview. Oct. 2, 2000.

Web Site

- **Author. "Title of Page." Site. Date accessed. <url>.**
- "Greece-Crete Clashes." CNN. Oct. 2, 2002. <<http://cnn.com/sooo/WORLD/meast/10/01/mideast.violence/index.html>>

Note: If you use SIRS Database for information, you can treat those articles as newspaper or magazine articles for your bibliography.

Bibliography Format

How to Write a Bibliography

Step 1: Use the **Bibliography Record** worksheet to record all the important information from the books, encyclopedias, almanacs, magazines, newspapers, and websites that you are using for your research. (SAMPLE BELOW)
