Database Sources:



Enter your topic in subject search. This database covers US and World History. See also lists of topics under the History icons at the bottom of the search page.



Enter a keyword or combination of keywords (e.g. dust bowl); click on “clear all” and select News and Magazines. Click on Search. Results can be printed, emailed, or saved to your student folder.



Good for searching for an article on a specific event between 1851 and 2007. Enter your event and then limit the search by decade. Look at the topics under the Topics tab for major events in American history. Also searchable by timeline to get a topic overview.



Includes *Great Events In History* from the 17th, 18th, 19th, and 20th Centuries. Click on Salem History on the E-Book page then search for your event.

--**Salem Great Events from History** – several sets – see the class bookcart.

--We have many specialized **Historical Encyclopedias**. Search the OPAC using your event name.

--We also have books titled “**Events that changed the World/America/Britain**” from the 16th through the 20th centuries. They can be located by searching for an event on the OPAC by **KEYWORD**; for example, Cold War or Great Depression or Slave Trade.

-- We have many book titles that begin with the words “**Daily Life ...**” Look for these in the OPALS OPAC using a **TITLE** search.
